

#### **Concept Note**

#### I. Rationale

In the past, it is undeniable that youth had served as vital component in the country's national development. To propel a nation towards genuine progress in this contemporary age, there is an urgent call to maximize youth participation in all aspects of society. United Nations Former Secretary-General Kofi Annan encapsulated the idea that young people should be at the forefront of global change and innovation believing that they can be key agents empowered for development and peace.

In 1965, the United Nations General Assembly began making efforts to improve the lives of youths around the world. The Declaration on the Promotion among Youth of the Ideals of Peace, Mutual Respect, and Understanding Between Peoples was approved, and there was an increase in the amount of time and resources given to empowering the youth. The same was done by recognizing emerging leaders and providing them with resources to satisfy the needs of the world.

In 1999, the World Conference of Ministers Responsible for Youth issued another request to mark International Youth Day. The resolution was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on December 17, 1999, and the first International Youth Day was observed on August 12, 2000.

The Philippines, with its rich historical timeline, has had remarkable flickers of student power showcased to the rest of the world. Undeniably, the power of the youth has always been at the pinnacle of the country's strife for freedom even during the time of colonization. With the pandemic limiting mobility and interaction, the Department of Education (DepEd) understands the need to heighten the thrust for youth development and participation. Young people should be provided with a platform that will pave the way for participatory and inclusive engagements promoting the DepEd Core Values and highlighting their skills, talents, perspectives, and sentiments in various discussions.

Thus, the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Operations, through the Bureau of Learner Support Services-Learner Formation Division (BLSS-LFD) in cooperation with Schools Division Office of Pasig City, will hold the International Youth Day (IYD) Celebration on August 12, 2023, in Pasig City, Philippines.

Observed every year on August 12, the IYD offers a platform to honor the qualities of youth and the potential that they hold towards the development of a nation and the world as a whole. The day also acknowledges the challenges faced by them and address issues that concern them. A lot of contribution is made by young people towards community development, in protection of environment and volunteering on various social projects. The day calls everyone to join the efforts of United Nation (UN) and help it achieve its Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Department seeks to gather selected learners, youth leaders, and education stakeholders with diverse backgrounds from different elementary and secondary institutions within Metro Manila and nearby local communities/regions. The said gathering will be done in a face-to-face arrangement that will allow the learner participants the opportunity to learn not only from the key national and international speakers and activities but also learn by engaging with one another, especially

#### VII. Legitimization

The working committee shall collect information from the participants through registration forms, attendance sheets, and post-activity questionnaires. The data sets shall include the total number of participants, their region, and personal details such as gender, age, etc., and their assessment of the activity. Afterwards, participants will be given a certificate of participation as proof of their appearance all throughout the convergence.

To ensure the sustainability of the gains from the event, the BLSS-YFD will plan regular consultations among the learners as a means of monitoring the demands from and accomplishments of the youth.
