Background

APNIEVE is a non-profit organization of individuals and institutions from the private and public sectors and is affiliated with the United Nations Educational, Social, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). The network was founded by a group of eight experts from Australia, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Russian Federation, and Thailand in March 1995 in Seoul.

Inspired by UNESCO's vision-mission of "Peace for Development and Development for Peace," APNIEVE was created "to promote and develop international education and values education for peace, human rights, democracy, and sustainable development through networking and cooperation among individuals, groups and institutions working on these fields in the Asia Pacific and the rest of the world."

The organization achieves this through the "preparation of teaching-learning materials and the training of administrators and teachers from all levels in the use of a holistic approach to education and the integration of values across the curriculum."

UNESCO celebrated its fifth International Day of Education, last January 26, 2023, under the theme, **To Invest in People, Prioritize Education**. Education must be prioritized to accelerate progress towards all the SDGs against the backdrop of a global recession, growing inequalities, and the climate crisis. The year 2023 marks the mid-point since the UN adopted the 2030 Agenda for people, planet, and prosperity, with a set of 17 interlocked goals. The international community rallied around six calls to action that each carry the potential to accelerate change. Led by coalitions of partners, these global initiatives span critical areas: foundational learning; the green and digital transitions; gender equality; education in crisis and financing (https://en.unesco.org/sites/default/files/education_day_2023-cn-en.pdf).

By identifying potential opportunities and challenges and creating strategies to capitalize on them or overcome them, futures thinkers can help to create a better future. Patches of excellence may be found in digital education,

pedagogies and strategies for values education and international education, and innovations with the use of ICT (World Bank, 2020).

Reimagining Values-Centered Learning Spaces of Excellence and Wellbeing

Positive values modeling by teaching and non-teaching staff is at the core of values-centered learning spaces. It creates a learning environment where learners are motivated to pursue excellence, grounded in a holistic sense of wellbeing as a person. Peace, respect for human rights, care for the environment, gender sensitivity-these are all values that can have long-lasting impact on young minds and hearts when modeled to them by caring and trusted adults. We need to begin reimagining educational practices that focus on values modeling by teaching and non-teaching personnel.

MATATAG-Bansang Makabata, Batang Makabansa

MATATAG: Bansang Makabata, Batang Makabansa is the Department of Education's new direction for the agency and its stakeholders to solve basic education challenges. MATATAG has four critical components:

MAke the curriculum relevant to produce competent and job-ready, active, and responsible citizens;

TAke steps to accelerate delivery of basic education facilities and services;

TAke good care of learners by promoting learner well-being, inclusive education, and a positive learning environment; and

GIve support to teachers to teach better (DepEd 2023).

Achieving Sustainable Development Goals through Education

Sustainable Development Goals 2030 address global issues and problems making it necessary for present and future citizens to consider these goals in pursuing their careers in any chosen field. A deeper understanding of these goals will help students develop insights on the root causes of problems such as food security, environment, gender inequality that are experienced by people even from different cultures around the world. Integrating the SDGs in classroom discussions or in meaningful school activities will bring the vision of the goals into the consciousness of learners who will be the future-thinkers and next leaders. Student engagement in communities will further advance and promote the goals as students create actions that are relevant and with sustainable impact to the needs of individuals and groups within their communities.

The themes revolve around the leading-edge thinking about transforming education, the innovative approaches and practices, and the assessment, monitoring, and evaluation; and the gaps where more research and efforts are needed. These topics are situated within the context of APNIEVE's twin thrusts: values education and international education, and APNIEVE's core values of peace, human rights, democracy, gender equity, and sustainable development, to achieve inclusive and quality education by 2030.
