Greetings from The LoveLife Project for Health & Environment Inc., a non-profit non-stock organization by media professionals and marginalized groups of persons with disabilities, persons living with chronic health conditions, persons with lived mental health experiences, tuberculosis patients, COVID-19 patients, person living with HIV, LGBTIQ persons, youth, and women from low-income communities who envision a society where people live optimally healthy, happy, and productive.

To celebrate the 45th National Disability Prevention and Rehabilitation Week in partnership with the National Commission for Culture and the Arts, National Council for Disability Affairs Office, DSWD-NCR National Vocational and Rehab Center, and the Quezon City government through the QC PDAO, we are holding the *Persons with Digitabilities International Film Festival and Educational Conference (PWDIFF)* on July 20 to 21, at the QC X Museum, inside the QC Memorial Circle Park, Elliptical Road, Barangay Central, Quezon City, with an expected participation from international organizations, NGAs, NGOs, government institutions, academe, stakeholders, and media.

The Persons with Digitabilities International Film Festival and Educational Conference (PWDIFF) which aims to develop and give voice to persons with disabilities all over the country and raise awareness of disabilities, diseases, disasters, inclusion, and PWD rights in the community, workplace, and the academe is designed to be a series of pocket festivals with digitabilities workshops and health-expert talks that we hope to bring to different parts of the country. The PWDIFF hopes that cities and campuses will host and sponsor our caravan so that we can reach more key affected populations and educate more.

In this light, we would like to offer free passes for your department heads and teachers from cities of Metro Manila for the following:

- The Film Festival is a series of movie screenings followed by expert talks and testimonials on disabilities, diseases, disasters, pwd inclusion, accessibility, and rights. Arts, MAPEH, Social Studies, and PTA heads and teachers can attend for free. If they attend the whole day session from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm either on Thursday, July 20, or Friday, July 21, they will be provided an e-certificate.
- The Educational Conference on Technology, Disability Inclusion, and Mental Health will tackle technology
 for flexible or blended learning systems and disability inclusion and will be for two consecutive days. ICT
 and STEM heads and teachers can attend for free subject to first come first served and limited number of
 two per municipality/city.
- The Quezon City government hosts the opening program, and we humbly request for a representative from DEPED NCR to speak on Disability Inclusion and Accessibility in Public Schools.














Persons with Digitabilities International Film Festival and Workshop Caravan



Hundreds to thousands of your constituents or students can learn digitabilities for work-ready skills and storytelling while learning about disabilities, diseases, disasters, inclusion, and persons with disabilities' rights through the Persons with Digitabilities International Film Festival (PWDIFF) which is on its 3rd year of winning the contest grant from the National Commission for Culture and the Arts and aims to enhance the digital skills and talents of PWDs and raise understanding of disability, diseases, inclusion, and PWD rights. It is a series of pocket hybrid events from July to December in key cities and campuses around the country.

The LoveLife Project is the program implementer while Crisaldo Pablo is the Festival Director and Designer. The implementers are the YEAHA Channel Workshop Scholars who are persons with disabilities, persons with chronic diseases, youth, and students of media, marketing, and technology.

The PWDIFF has the following programs: (1) film festival for, about, and by PWDs where each movie screening is followed or preceded by expert talks and testimonials; (2) PWD jobs fair; (3) PWD and Allies Products Exhibit and Bazaar; and (4) National Conference on Technology, Disability Inclusion, and Mental Health for educators, teachers, and schools.

The Film Festival will have movies by professional filmmakers and amateur content-creators. Scholars of the PWDigitabilities Storytelling Workshop offered by The LoveLife Project will showcase their outputs. There will be expert talks after or before each movie screenings.

PWDIFF Media Projects Brief



Instead of asking for donations, we create videos, movies, events, and workshops for community empowerment, fundraising, and sustainability. We offer our video, film, and events production services too. This 2023, we won three contest grants, two from the National Commission for Culture and the Arts and one from the National Council for Children's Television, to produce a movie, a film festival, and a television series.

Rationale

To create positive representations of PWDs in arts, movies, stories, and media, the PWDIFF is a concept and project created, implemented, and managed by, for, and with PWDs. To raise awareness and understanding of disability, diseases, inclusion, and PWD rights, we must create stories that celebrate the positive aspects of our lives and showcase them in a community gathering event. The PWDIFF is the first in Asia of its kind.




The PWDIFF is for, by, and about PWDs and integrates films, talks, conversations, a PWD BAZAAR where they can sell and earn, and a JOB FAIR where they can connect with businesses that have inclusive employment opportunities.

Opportunities: We can hold a Caravan of the PWDigitabilities Workshop and Festival and hold at least two separate pocket events in districts of Quezon City at minimal a cost.

















The LoveLife Project for Health & Environment Inc.



We are a non-stock non-profit civil society organization of service-users who are multi-media professionals and persons with disabilities, with lived (mental health) experiences, with lived tuberculosis disease experiences, living with chronic health conditions, living with HIV, youth, and LGBTQI+ who envision a society where people live optimally healthy, happy, and productive. We are development and health communication experts with a collective experience of around 30 years.

This 2023 we are implementing the 3rd year of the *Persons with Digitabilities International Film Festival* which won a contest grant from the National Commission for Culture and the Arts and aims to enhance Digitabilities by PWDs and PLWNCDs and raise awareness about disability, diseases, inclusion, and accessibility. We also won a contest grant by the National Council for Children's Television to produce a short digital tv series on youth mental health titled *Friendship Puzzles*. Our Creative Director and Resident Artist Crisaldo Pablo also won a contest grant by NCCA to produce an advocacy movie titled *Haybrid ang Puso ni Ma'am* which we are line-producing.

Integrated into the *PWDIFF* is our YAEHA Digital Empowerment and Storytelling for Mental Resilience and Livelihood Workshop for persons with disabilities and marginalized youth which we have been implementing since 2018. The Training Model won an international award from the Netherlands for Voices of Inclusion using digital technology in January 2020.

LoveLife has worked with international and local organizations as well as government agencies to produce and implement health advocacy projects, events, and videos, such as the American Bar Association Rule of Law Initiative Philippines, Department of Health National Capital Region Infectious Diseases Cluster, Department of Environment and Natural Resources Biodiversity Management Bureau (PAWB ICRMP), Forest Management Bureau, Department of Health National Tuberculosis Program, Philippine Business for Social Progress, Save the Children Philippines, Pilipinas Shell Foundation Inc., Bacoor City, Pasig City, and Quezon City, among others. We successfully implemented the Global Fund to Fight HIV NFM from 2016 to 2017 and during the last quarter, we were selected to be the only organization to implement advocacy activities in two cities.

Our collective of officers and talents have worked in international programs and locally produced award-winning television, film, and digital content, such as I Witness, Master Chef Asia, Eat Bulaga, Emergency, Pinoy MD, Reporter's Notebook, Wish Ko Lang, Goyong, Die Beautiful, Clarita, Amazing Race Israel, World's Got Talent, etc.
