#### Dear Asec. Galban.

The Philippines faces the fastest-growing HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) epidemic, as indicated by the 2022 Global AIDS Monitoring Report. It is estimated that there will be 55,800 People Living with HIV (PLHIV) by the end of 2023, and this trend is expected to continue if no interventions are done. Furthermore, it is estimated that two (2) out of three (3) new HIV infections occur in the 15 to 24-year-old age group. Based on 2022 Integrated HTV Behavioral & Serologic surveillance (IHBSS), lack of awareness, lack of training and outdated HIV school references are one of the challenges identified and data states that there is a one (1) year lag of condom use for the said age group increasing the risk of getting the disease.

The Department of Health – Metro Manila Center for Health Development (DOH-MMCHD) embarked on a fast-track approach towards ending the AIDS epidemic as a public health threat by 2030, with the goal of achieving the ambitious 95-95-95 targets by 2028. Annually on December 1, the nation observes World AIDS Day. This year, the theme will be "Let Communities Lead", recognizing PLHIV community efforts and fostering unity to raise awareness about the disease and commit to ending it by 2030. The DOH-MMCHD, in partnership with the Local Government Unit (LGU) and Project Red Ribbon Care Management Foundation, Inc. will be hosting the 1st Metro Manila AIDS Walk: A Walk to End AIDS by 2030.

The AIDS Walk is proposed to be held in the historical Quirino Grandstand, Rizal Park and will involve walking along Roxas Boulevard to Rajah Sulayman Park, then return to the Grandstand where there will be activities on stage. This event will start at 4:30 AM on Saturday, December 2, 2023, the main target participants of the said event are the youth aged 15 years old and above, walking together with their families, national and local government agencies, health institutions, the private sector, non-government organizations, and the key affected communities.

Given the public health significance of this inaugural event, we would like to invite you and your representative to participate in this event. Since the main target participants are the youth, we kindly request your assistance that learners from Grade 10 to Grade 12 and their teachers/advisors to take part in this activity. We would also greatly appreciate if the entire Department of Education (DepEd) and all its employees would also support this momentous
