



THE SOUTHEAST ASIA PLUS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS YOUTH CAMP 2024 January 29- February 2, 2024 Nakhon Ratchasima Province, Thailand

1. Background

The Sufficiency Economy Philosophy, introduced by His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej over50 years ago, places strong emphasis on sustainable development, self-reliance, social equity, environmental stewardship, ethical values, cultural preservation, and global relevance. It is fully aligned with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

To ensure that the principles of the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy are effectively transmitted to the younger generation, it has been seamlessly integrated into the Thai basic education curriculum. This integration equips learners with the necessary knowledge and skills to champion sustainable development and adopt sustainable lifestyles. These educational efforts thrive in environments that encourage sufficiency-based sustainability learning and actively support interaction with local communities.

In this context, the SEAMEO Regional Centre for Sufficiency Economy Philosophy for Sustainability (SEAMEO SEPS) is dedicated to organising the Southeast Asia Plus Sustainable Development Goals Youth Camp 2024. This initiative is designed to promote the values and principles of the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy among youth while actively engaging them with the United Nations' SDG goals, fostering a deep understanding of sustainable development and its significance in today's world.

The Southeast Asia Plus Sustainable Development Goals Youth Camp 2024 is a collaborative initiative organised by SEAMEO-SEPS and Suranaree University of Technology (SUT). The Youth Camp brings together experiences of youth and teachers from Thailand and other SEAMEO Member Countries through various activities that would allow discussions and the sharing of experiences aimed at promoting sustainability.

2. Objectives

- a. To build a comprehensive understanding of the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy (SEP) and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- b. To ignite a sense of inspiration among the youth in SEAMEO Member Countries, encouraging them to champion the incorporation of SEP into sustainability efforts in their schools and communities
- c. To nurture the skills and mindset necessary for a human-centered approach to problem-solving, using design thinking within the framework of SEP and SDGs
- To facilitate valuable networking opportunities among the youth, fostering connections and collaborations
- e. To establish a network of schools for sharing knowledge and best practices on SEP and the SDGs

5. Outputs

- b. From networking among youth, teachers and schools in the SEAMEO members, they can share and exchange common interests in improving problem-solving effectively

The Southeast Asia Plus Sustainable Development Goals Youth Camp 2024 will take place in Nakhon Ratchasima Province, Thailand. The camp will center its attention on the convergence of the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy and the Sustainable Development Goals, with a particular emphasis on the Southeast Asian region, notably the SEAMEO Member Countries.

The Student Entrepreneurship Development Academy of the Suranaree University of Technology will lead the conduct of the youth camp. The design thinking approach will be employed to generate innovative solutions for a spectrum of design problems. This method underscores the significance of employing empathy to identify human-centered solutions. Students will be exposed to other skills such as problem-solving, collaboration, and creativity. Meanwhile, teachers will obtain insights on various activities that could be useful in teaching and learning processes.




