## Training Workshop on Policy Implementation and Assessment

Policy, Planning and Research Division Once Again Hosted a Successful Training Workshop







On June 28, 2024, the Policy, Planning and Research Division successfully concluded a three-day Training Workshop on Policy Implementation and Assessment. This workshop, held on June 25, 27, and 28, brought together key stakeholders from various divisions to enhance their understanding and skills in navigating the complexities of policy implementation.

The workshop targeted Assistant Schools Division Superintendents, Chiefs of CID and SGOD, ROP Functional Chiefs, Selected ROP Personnel, PPRD Personnel, and CO resource persons. Although not all proposed participants could attend due to scheduling conflicts, representatives were sent to ensure the division's interests were well-represented.

### Workshop Highlights

The workshop covered a comprehensive range of topics, including the DepEd Policy statement, Policy Development Process, Policy adoption, Policy Implementation, Analysis techniques, Review, and Monitoring and Evaluation. Participants were introduced to the procedures for developing and issuing a procedural map for the formulation, adoption, and review of DepEd policies. This initiative aimed to involve DepEd stakeholders in the policy-making process, ensuring a collaborative approach to effective governance.
