

Greetings,

We, from the University of the Philippines, Diliman - National College of Public Administration and Governance - Center for Local and Regional Governance (UP-NCPAG-CLRG), are writing this message in order to clarify some details with respect to MEMORANDUM OM-OUOPS-2024-09-06160 or the memorandum endorsing the conduct of research of mental health activities at the school and community level.

Adjustments to the Period of Activity: The original completion date endorsed in the memorandum was dated 31 July, 2024 as the data gathering activity was originally scheduled to happen April to June, 2024. However, due to the adjustment of the signatory and the preparation for the transition within DepEd the letter was only endorsed 1 August, 2024. Upon discussion with representatives from the Bureau of Learner Support Services-School Health Division (BLSS-SHD) we are tentatively scheduling the online data collecting activities to happen starting from the 3rd to 4th week of September up till the end of November 2024. After some preparation of the final data gathering instrument, UP-NCPAG-CLRG will initiate contact and coordinate with each region in order to best match everyone's schedule.

Documents to Prepare: In order to streamline the process and establish baseline data for the study, we are kindly requesting the following documents to be prepared in advance so that the UP-NCPAG-CLRG team can better refine its data gathering instrument:

- Existing policies at the school level with respect to mental health, or documents describing mental health activities, if any;
- Existing policies at the regional level with respect to mental health, if any;
- Official designations and job descriptions of people tasked to conduct mental health-related activities at the school level; and
- Number of cases designated as a "mental health" case and documents related to the rationale as to why such cases were deemed as mental health cases.

We believe that your cooperation in this study will provide valuable insights that can be used to develop a capacity development program on mental health first response.





Mental Health Initiatives in Philippine Local Governance Part 1: Reviewing Possibilities for Multi-Stakeholder Capacity Development for Mental Health First Response

Background and Rationale	In the face of student suicides, increasing student suicide attempts, and the rising number of Department of Education (DepEd) students seeking school guidance services during the COVID-19 Pandemic and after, enhancing existing mental health promotion and the delivery of mental health services in Philippine primary education has become an important priority for DepEd to address (Felipe, 2023). Moreover, part of DepEd's mandates in Republic Act No. 11036, also known as the Mental Health Act, requires DepEd to pursue strategies that promote the realization of mental health and well-being in educational institutions (Republic of the Philippines, 2018). To fulfill its mandates, the 2024 national budget has allocated two hundred and ten million pesos (P210M), attempting to ensure the effectiveness of programs implemented by the Department (Senate of the Philippines, 2023).	
	However, five years after the enactment of the Mental Health Act, there has been criticism of its implementation as it seems that there is no strategy to harmonize the various mental health programs of different national agencies and local government units (LGUs). "Every LGU or academic institution needs its own program for mental health services. What is the status of the effort in the LGUs and academic institutions? Yes, there are apps, but there's supposed to be tangible actions or programs to [accompany] what was cascaded to the LGUs." states Gabriella Representative Arlene Brosasa in the House committee briefing on rising violence, and suicide cases among students (paraphrased in Macasero, 2023). LGUs and local mental health ordinances are further identified as key to alleviating logistical problems related to realizing the Mental Health Act nationwide.	
	"Mental health ordinances will complement the Philippine Mental Health Law and localize response to prevent suicide, boost diagnosis and treatment of persons with mental health needs, and combat stigma [] Removing barriers to mental health services through localized interventions needs commitment from everyone in the community,"	
	Philippine Mental Health Association National Executive Director Dr. Carolina Uno-Rayco states (qtd. in Sarao, 2023), though local initiatives and ordinances exist (Yabut et al., 2023) the quality of programs varies depending on LGU resources, the vision of mental health service delivery, coordination with other sectors, and scope of service provision.	
	In the past, multi-stakeholder capacity development programs in the health sector have proven to demonstrate some effectiveness in addressing mental health needs of a	



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vi) City Health Workers to gather their institutional and personal experiences with the delivery of mental health programs within the public school and outside in their localities. Highlight key indicators, conditions, and strategies that make such programs effective and sustainable in the long-term; Develop an evidenced-based multi-stakeholder mental health first response capacity development program that can be implemented in Philippine LGUs, and Build a database of existing mental health programs in the Philippines. Scope The research focuses on doing an initial assessment of (i) the current state of Mental Health service delivery within schools in the 3 island groups (Luzon, Visayas, Mindanao) and NCR and (ii) the school's interface with other mental health service delivery programs from the national and local government units. Survey questionnaires and key informant interviews (KIIs) will be used to collect information and create the initial database of the mental health services that are currently offered in the Philippines. Due to time and financial restrictions, the KIIs and survey for the island groups of the Visayas and Mindanao will be conducted via Zoom. After the research, it is envisioned that the output of the research will be used to develop a pilot case where DepEd and LGUs can collaborate in i) implementing a capacity development program for mental health first response for multi-stakeholders in a locality and ii) translating the results towards a participatory driven mental health first aid program for that locality. After its implementation, recommendations on how to refine and scale the program across localities will be generated. 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locality and developing a comprehensive community-based mental health program within municipalities (WHO, 2017). However, evidence suggests these have not translated into widespread adoption and institutionalization across localities. Similar findings are true of former DepEd bottom-up programs in that though community programs may find high local success, these have not translated into institutional practice changes (Bautista et al., 2010).

In summary, community mental health is a problem that needs to be addressed by all sectors. Though local efforts persist in response to the Mental Health Act, a strategy to harmonize programs and strategies has yet to be seen. Ultimately, developing mental health programs and policies that address the local situation is not enough. How these can be sustained long-term and institutionalized must also be addressed.

Purpose

To address the issue mentioned above, the Center for Local and Regional Governance (CLRG), backed by over 50 years of expertise in assisting and empowering local government sectors, developing capacity-building programs for LGUs, and translating research into policy solutions, proposes to conduct research reviewing existing mental health initiatives and policies at the school and community/barangay level. CLRGs purpose is to develop an extension program capacitating public school teachers, students, and LGU employees in i) conducting psychological first response, ii) developing community affordances to alleviating mental health issues, (iii) build a database of existing mental health programs in the Philippines; and iv) integrating multistakeholder roles within the local legislative process.

Though unable to replace the work of licensed professionals, developing the capacity of schools and communities to recognize and provide basic assistance to their fellow citizens and students and providing institutional support and platforms to do so is seen as a cost-effective way of promoting mental health awareness and lessening the severity of mental health effects within localities. Moreover, by designing this extension program to be jointly undertaken for its entire duration, from capacity building up to policy development and implementation, this intervention hopes to serve as a model that can be cascaded in harmonizing mental health programs nationwide.

Objectives

- Conduct a literature review on:
 - i) the existing pandemic and post-pandemic (2019-2024) multi-stakeholder capacity development programs and research related to mental health in developing country contexts:
 - ii) community-based mental health first response practices, and
 - iii) integrating community-based proposals in existing institutional affordances (i.e., policies and practices) within developing country contexts in public schools.
- 2) Conduct key informant interviews (KIIs) and surveys with:
 - i) Teachers
 - ii) Guidance Counselors
 - iii) Students
 - iv) Nurse
 - v) Barangay Health Workers
