

This request has reference to the upcoming conduct of the Philippines' Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) Council Presidency Flagship Program Number 4 (FP 4) titled "Shifting Mindset: Transforming Perception of Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET) in Southeast Asia" scheduled for November 21-22, 2024 in Metro Manila, Philippines.

The activity will be jointly organized by the Department of Education (DepEd) and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) with the aim of enhancing the educational experience of Senior High School (SHS) students and discuss strategies for elevating TVET's image as a viable career option for young learners.

During the program, a keynote message on TVET from the Perspective of Parents and Students will be delivered by a parents' association representative and a senior high school student from the Philippines. The select speakers will be invited to share their experiences, concerns, and aspirations to allow policy makers to gather valuable insights and address the misconceptions and shift the societal mindset regarding TVET. The speakers are scheduled to deliver their message on the first day of the program on November 21, 2024 at 09:30 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.

The nominated speakers will be provided with accommodation, meals during the meeting, and airfare, and airport transfers (if applicable). In case of land travel, the fare will be reimbursed.





Launch of the Rapid Scoping Study on Out-of-School Children and Youth (OOSCY) in Southeast Asia

CONCEPT NOTE

I. Background


Access to inclusive, equitable, and quality education is the primary goal of every education system in Southeast Asia. However, a substantial number of children and youth in Southeast Asia remain out of school. In a 2017 situational analysis on out-of-school children and youth (OOSCY) in nine Southeast Asian countries, around seven million primary and lower secondary school-age children were out of school. Another study by UNICEF for East Asia and the Pacific (EAP) found that 7 million (4%) of primary school age and 8 million (8%) of lower secondary school age were out of school. While the number of OOSCY in Southeast Asia has significantly reduced in the last 20 years, these improvements were in upper and lower secondary levels and for girls at all levels. For example, Cambodia significantly reduced the number of lower secondary school-age learners from 85% in 2000 to 13% in 2017.

However, it was estimated that the COVID-19 pandemic increased the number of children and youth who were not enrolled in school, making it necessary to update the regional data and the situation of OOSCY in Southeast Asia to validate the extent of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the OOSCY situation.


With the lack of updated data, and recognising new developments in education technology, globalisation, and climate change, among others, revisiting the numbers and initiatives for OOSCY in Southeast Asia is imperative. Understanding the reasons behind dropping out or non-enrollment and evaluating existing policies and programmes are crucial for designing effective and targeted policy and programme interventions.

The rapid scoping study on OOSCY in Southeast Asia will provide an overview of the current situation of OOSCY in Southeast Asia, including the extent of the problem, the factors contributing to it, and the existing policies and programmes in place to address it. The study also proposes recommendations for strengthening existing policies and programmes and introducing targeted interventions.











II. Objectives of the Launch

The launch of the rapid scoping study on OOSCY in Southeast Asia seeks to:

- Disseminate the key findings and recommendations of the study;
- Provide a platform for policymakers and stakeholders to discuss the recommendations
 of the study and identify ways forward; and
- Promote collaboration and partnerships among stakeholders to address the issue of OOSCY

III. Participants

- Representatives from international organisations and development partners
- Civil society organisations working on education and child rights


