In compliance with the DepEd Order (DO) No. 21, s. 2015, titled "Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Coordination and Information Management Protocol," and DO No. 33, s. 2021, titled "School-Based Disaster Preparedness and Response Measures for Tropical Cyclones, Flooding, and Other Weather-related Disturbances and Calamities," the Office of the Undersecretary for Operations through the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Service (DRRMS) reminds all affected field offices and schools to maintain the activation of the Regional, Division, and School DRRM Teams and conduct effective and timely submission and vetting of RADaR affected by Tropical Cyclones "Nika", "Ofel", and "Pepito". The submission of RADaR by all affected schools must be done within 72 hours in the aftermath of the occurrence of the hazard.

Due to the subsequent tropical cyclones affecting various regions and to streamline the reporting process, the DRRMS hereby informs on the combined reporting of Tropical Cyclones "Nika", "Ofel", and "Pepito" through the existing RADaR trigger disseminated previously by this Office. All schools that have already submitted reports are directed to update their previous RADaR submissions to include data reflecting the damage caused by the subsequent tropical cyclones. This is to ensure a comprehensive and unified report without duplicating efforts.

Meanwhile, affected schools that have already submitted RADaR from previous tropical cyclones "Nika" and/or "Ofel" with no additional incurred damages or changes in the previously submitted RADaR from the succeeding tropical cyclones ("Ofel" and/or "Pepito") may not be required to update.

Moreover, all affected Division Offices must submit the combined vetted RADaR to their respective Regional Offices and the DRRMS no later than **November 29, 2024.**

With the maintained activation of Division DRRM Teams of affected field offices, the Division DRRM Team, with the leadership of the Schools Division Superintendent as Emergency Responsible Official, should strategize to meet the deadline of submission (e.g., augmentation of DepEd personnel to the Division DRRM Team from within and outside the Division Office to expedite the validation/vetting of RADaR).

The DRRM Coordinators concerned shall facilitate the consolidation of vetted RADaR and the provision of needed response interventions to affected schools.

All vetted RADaR and reports on the response interventions provided shall be submitted to the DRRMS through email at drrmo@deped.gov.ph, with a copy furnished to johnherbert.nieva@deped.gov.ph.
